planting time of the year, and so plenty to talk about this week. So The PWARE plenty to calk about this week. So far, the weather has certainly not been the gardener's best friend! The garden centres are full of new plants and ideas, and as we are hardy types, we will not let the weather ruin our enthusiasm for spring planting!

As Labour Weekend approaches, it should be safe to plant out all those vegetable start need sunshine and warmth to grow. Vegetables

those vegetables that need sunshine and warmth to grow. Vegetables like tomatoes, cucumbers, courgettes, pumploins, peopers watermelon, and chilles to name a few. I will still be putting some protection around them, like simple polythene or windbreak, lister to give them the extra warmth and shelter from any strong winds we may still get. Top ig to his week, is when planting your tomatoes, tease the root ball (if it has one, more so if it is a

grafted tomato) water really well with a liquid ertiliser, then plant and leave three weeks before fertiliser, then plant and leave three weeks before watering again. This will help promote good roots, as the plant will search for all the moisture it can, especially if being planted in shrub tubs or pots. Once it starts to flower, this is where the fruit form, then water well. This is necessary as to the control of the so, and keep regular side dressing of your crop, as they grow, and don't forget to mound them up

as they grow, and don't forget to mound them up and protect your potatoes from any sunlight. Green potatoes are poistonous, so all care when mounding up will protect your growing crop. Feed your strawberry plants, and don't forget to lay some strawberry hyd down, to keep fruit off soil, if you haven't already done so. Salad season is here, so successive plantings of lettuces, radiathes, spring orions, successive plantings of fettuces, radishes, spring onions, beetroot, peas and beans, will get your garden off to a great start, and before long you will soon be eating your own home-grown vegetables, of which you have control, of what is being put on them. Remember to keep planting as coloural crops as you can, they are so much healther for us, but also look great on our plates. 
