Gardening With Sue From Hammer (Sue Marsh)

Well here we are at the prime planting time of the year, and so plenty to talk about this week. So far, the weather has certainly not been the gardener's best friend! The garden centres are full of new plants and ideas, and as we are hardy types, we will not let the weather ruin our enthusiasm for spring planting!

As Labour Weekend approaches, it should be safe to plant out all those vegetables that need sunshine and warmth to grow. Vegetables like tomatoes, cucumbers, courgettes, pumpkins, peppers, watermelon, and chillies to name a few. I will be putting some protection around them, like simple polythene or windbreak, just to give them the extra warmth and shelter from any strong winds we may still get. Top tip this week, is when planting your tomatoes, tease the root ball (if it has one, more so if it is a grafted tomato) water really well with a liquid fertiliser, then plant and leave three weeks before watering again. This will help promote good roots, as the plant will search for all the moisture it can, especially if being planted in shrub roots or pots. Once it starts to flower, this is where the fruit form, then water well. This is necessary as tomatoes are mostly water, so we can assume we should be doing maybe the same for cucumbers. If someone has a good method for growing cucumbers, then let me know, love cucumbers, but don't always have a good crop.

Plant your potatoes now, if you have not done so, and keep regular side dressing of your crop, as they grow, and don't forget to mound them up and protect your potatoes from any sunlight. Green potatoes are poisonous, so all care when mounding up will protect your growing crop.

Feed your strawberry plants, and don't forget to lay some straw/bay hay down, to keep fruit off soil, if you haven't already done so. Salad season is here, so successive plantings of lettuces, radishes, spring onions, beetroot, peas and beans, will get your garden off to a great start, and before long you will soon be eating your own home-grown vegetables, of which you have control, of what is being put on them. Remember to keep planting as colourful crops as you can, they are so much healthier for us, but also look great on our plates. Happy Gardening!

Community Board News (Kevin Rowan)

Trimble Park Walkway: Work is expected to be undertaken in the next few months on Stage 1 of the Trimble Park walkway. This arises as a review of the plan for this area which was initiated several years ago.

The board has reviewed the proposed route and made some minor changes in light of potential improvements to the Jubilee Park playground, skatepark and the mini golf. So the route will now commence from Rata Street opposite the new mini golf area, and wind its way up Trimble Park hill to a viewing point. It is intended that a suitable gradient will allow wheelchair and mobility scooter access. This section will be paved in concrete to minimise maintenance and is expected to be completed by Christmas, subject to suitable weather.

It is intended at a later date to complete the route following a line adjacent to the Croquet Club and the stream bank behind the Te Kohanga Moa Marae, exiting onto Sandish Street beside the housing for the elderly units. This will be dependent on future funding.

Jubilee Park Playground: Options to replace the existing playground equipment are on view at the library at the moment. You are invited to have your say by voting at the library or completing the online survey on the NPDC website or via various facebook pages. This is the first step in the redevelopment and there should be further equipment added once costs are established and additional funding becomes available. Those with accessibility issues will be catered for as this is recognised as an important issue.
