

Ingelwood Ladies Rest Rooms Upgrade (Anthea Browns)

NEW ZEALAND RED CROSS The Ingelwood Ladies Rest Rooms fund raising and planning stages from 1935 and were finally built as a Centennial Memorial in 1940 with money raised by a Ladies committee with help from both the Ingelwood Borough and County councils. In 1972 the Red Cross Rooms were added thanks to a Ingelwood RSA public appeal. Now 75 years after being built they are getting a major upgrade to again best serve the community.

After a long time of planning and arranging funding it has been a very quick start to the renovations at the rooms.

These long awaited renovations started on Monday 19 June and the 8-12 week project will maintain the original exterior of the building but a rearranged interior floor plan will enable both Plunket and the Red Cross to better meet the current needs of their clients. It is an exciting development that will include accessible toilet facilities, and a 26 m² meeting room that will be available for hire to other groups in the community.

While the build is on, Ingelwood Plunket Clinics are continuing as booked. Plunket didn't get a chance to let many of their clients know about it started and wish to advise that they are temporary premises in a room at Ingelwood Top Kids on the corner of Cutfield and Kelly streets. A reminder of this location will be included in the text that is now sent to families the day before appointments. Plunket appreciates this support from Top Kids in providing this venue and local staff Anthea and Suzanne are looking forward to catching up with you. If your child doesn't currently have their next Plunket visit already booked please call Plunket Hub on 765453 and an appointment can be booked in. While funding has been obtained for the main renovation costs Plunket have a wish list of items as yet unfunded, should anyone wish to support Plunket in this way please call Lisa at the Plunket hub 7659453.

July, the middle of winter, and you will be excited for not wanting to spend time in the garden, on bleak, cold days.
