To track progress of our kivil population we have a permit KIVII or how reverse transmitters on our resident male kivil. One of our frequently asked questions is "do we have transmitters on all our kivil."

The answer is no, we have too many kivil.

The batteries life on the transmitters only last for about fourteen months.

The batteries like on the transmitters only last for about fourteen months to each year we have a dedicated team changing the batteries and at that same time all of our kwi get a health check, and key measurements taken weight, bill length and overall body condition.

This process of catching the birds can take weeks of dedicated time and additionable of the control of the contr

ransmitter signal as long as it is within a certain range. We are able to tell thich bird we have in range by each transmitter having a different aduency and been sequence

frequency and beep sequence.

The team were very excited with this latest check that we were able to track down one of our chicks, our kiwl called "Plurf" who was kindly adopted by the Phillips Innilly (New Plymouth). We have monitored Murf throughout his life stages from egg, chick and to adulthood and this check we noted egg, chick and to adulthood and this check we noted an even more exciting stage. We will continue to monitor Murf; although the territory he has moved into is out of our original project area the landowners have wholeheartedly agreed to support us and have volunteered to set up predator control in the area. 

## Gardening With Sue From Hammer (Sue Marsh) Phone 756 8009 Here we are now into late winter

HARD WARE and if you have not pruned your roses, then do not delay, they will need to be done this month on a clear fine day. There are a few simple rose care steps to take throughout the year, to help keep roses looking fabulous. During winter, there are town inpurant rose jobs, which will reward you with healthier roses and more flowers during the warmer months. Winterpruning, when the roses are leafless, is the ideal time to completely remove any dead stems (which are usually grey) and

completely are more any dead stems (which are usually grey) and then cut all the remaining healthy stems down to around knee height (parts missing health stems). If you have time, prince each sent to just above an outword fiscing buil. If you're time poor or a better stems, then take no notice of the buds!
