

Playground Design Picked For Jubilee Park

The voice is in and a design has been picked for the new playground at Inglewood's Jubilee Park. New Plymouth District Council had 429 ballots cast on seven designs and option three was the runaway winner with 109 votes.

A big thank to Inglewood for the great turnout, the community has run a great process with excellent input from the local kids and young people." NPDC Group Manager Strategy Liam Hodgetts said. NPDC is hoping to have the playground completed by March next year.

The plans were required to be suitable for children aged three to 15. The playground will be part of a project to make Jubilee Park a "destination" park that will attract visitors from outside Inglewood too. This also includes proposals for a new skate park, which is scheduled to be completed next year, and a public toilet near the play area by the end of this year.

Inglewood Lions Club's plans for an 18-hole mini-putt course are also a step closer with the NPDC drawing up a concessional ground lease for a site next to the play area. The Lions will pay \$1 a year for the lease and channel proceeds from the course back into community organisations.

"We're working with the Inglewood Community Board and local people to get the whole community participating and to raise a sense of stewardship for the project," said Mr Hodgetts. NPDC is also helping the Inglewood community in fundraising efforts for further improvements to Jubilee Park.

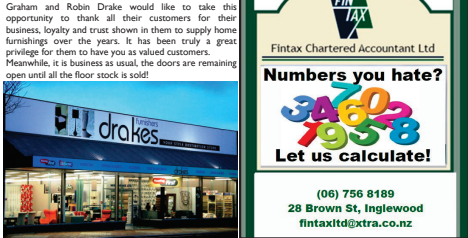
Drakes Furnishers End Of An Era (Robin Drake)




What can you expect from the show and its supporting album and related Stories of Von Tempky, the short life and tragic death of the righteously dancer and barmaid Jennie Anderson, an almost spoken word piece employing four eye witness accounts of the Tarawera eruption in 1886, real characters such as the minor Little Biddy Goodwin who died at 96 and was the country's only female miner, a tribute to the long gone gold mining town of St Bathans in Otago (it once had 13 pubs, today there's just one). There is cleverness here too: it's very hard not to break a laugh on Hokitika Moonshine Whiskey Blues (about a mother of seven home-still woman who liked a daily dram) which morphs naturally into wooty tea on Route 66; "If you ever plan to motor South ... get your hitch on Route 96 ... it winds from Matamoras to Chial ... more than 57 miles to get high ...". It's the most entertaining New Zealand history lesson you're likely to encounter.



Purangi Kiwi News (Karen Schumacher)

October is national kiwi month. With the goal of having kiwi population all increasing at 2% pa, we are quietly chuffed at our 9% growth. We are about to do a night mission to harvest eggs from a burrow we've got chicks, one will return to our project and the other we will gift to Rotokare to help their project. Bob has his fingers crossed that the male kaka called "Redwood" moves out of the burrow before the early hours of the morning, since we do not go near the burrow while he is inside. We are now working away at the pest control of rats and possums in the area where kōkako are to be released. We have a large number of the resetting traps installed. The A24 are the rat traps, and the A12 are the possum traps. These are a key tool to keep the predators at low levels.

We are thrilled that Farmlands have kicked off our request for help by donating an A12 possum resetting trap. These will kill 12 possums before we need to re-gas them. And they work! We have 1,000 hectares we need to do the control over which is a big area. The traps are available at Farmlands.





CLEANING OF INGLEWOOD'S WATER PIPES

Phase one of fixing Inglewood's intermittent discoloured water has begun.

Preparatory work is under way on the town's water mains, and from 6 November we will be cleaning the inside of most of Inglewood's water pipes. This will take about eight days, excluding Sunday.

While we do not expect the work to cause your tap water to become discoloured, we recommend you store some water before the cleaning begins as a precaution. In addition, a water tanker will be at the railway car park during the cleaning period for anyone who needs it.
