

Good gardening is all about preparation. This can involve weed removal, building up the soil with HAMMER compost, topping up with any of the specia Tormalated mixes fertilising, and then you might just be about ready to start planning. "Tippe ook two more weaks unail springimus," I realised there was much to do in my posto patch and other gardens if I was to repare them properly for the quickly fast approaching growing season. Firstly, weed control might just about be the worst job, as we start our preparation. Kiwis do like to reach for a bottle of any of the store-bought preparation. Kwis do kake to reach for a bottle of any of the store-bought weed killes available. Best applied in dry conditions, using a sprayer marked Weeds Orley, and the weed killer of your choice, you can at least make a start on the first going over of that poor effected granden bed. They are designed to treat the weed, not the soil, so



hould not leave anything in the soil to kill off your new course, there are small tools like trowels and forks, big tools like es, shovels and rakes, and powerful tools, like rotary hoes etc. nding on the size of your garden. Don't let the weeds defeat ou at the first hurdle, get the biggest ones out, and go back for a econd going over. Once you have removed the weeds, then its time to top up with compost. Either home-made or store-bought bags of to up up with compost, Enter nome-made or store-bought tags to smpost will do the trick. The convenience of bagged products akes it easy for every gardener, but if you want to start your own smpost heap, to take your grass clippings, food scraps and other arden waste, then its not hard to do, just give it a go.
