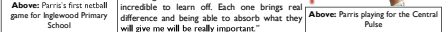

Spring Grass and Laminitis in Horses (Greg Hall)

Laminitis is a painful and potentially devastating disease of the foot that can lead to long lasting, crippling changes in function and lead to lifelong problems for the individual. Laminitis means inflammation (-itis) of the laminae in the hoof, this inflammation causes swelling and intense pain. There are 2 cases of interdigitating laminae; the sensitive laminae, which project from the pedal bone and the insensitive laminae, which are on the hoof wall side. The exact reasons as to why this inflammation occurs are numerous and we still do not fully understand all of the processes involved. What can cause laminitis? Typically, the disease is thought to affect overweight ponies on too much spring grass. Whilst this is often the case it is now thought that underlying metabolic disease may be implicated. For instance, Equine Metabolic Syndrome (EMS) has now been identified which leads to horses easily gaining weight and having an underlying high level of insulin in their blood which predisposes them to laminitis. Cushing's disease is another hormonal disease that tends to occur in the older horse or pony and leads to high levels of steroid in the blood stream which can again cause laminitis. Both of these problems can be diagnosed via a blood test. Whatever the underlying primary problem is the result is the same debilitating painful lameness. Talk to your vet about prevention and control of this common disease.
