Also in attendance was Henry and Jane Brown, children of Bob Brown (Mayor of Ingewood 1941-1971) the longest continuing serving mayor in New Zealand's history. It's amazing to see how the library has evolved over the years to become such a central hub for the community. From its historical time researched by Guy Laurence to the scaled plan of the original library by Kevin Laurence, it seems like a lot of effort has gone into preserving and celebrating its history. Call into the Library and view this display. The library's transformation from a place solely for books to a multifaceted community centre offering computers, magazines, puzzles, phone charging, and quiet reading areas is impressive. The weekly visits from the meetings of the Ingewood Family History Group, Community Board and the monthly book clubs highlight its role as a vibrant community space.

The dedication of the librarians and their reputation for being knowledgeable and helpful is truly commendable. It's clear that the Ingewood Municipal Library and Council Building is much more than just a library. The Library staff would like to thank the Ingewood Community for their support over the years. 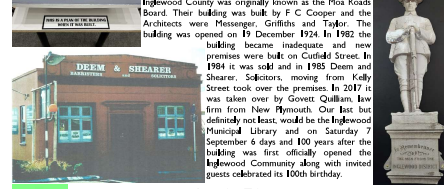
Daffodil Day Thank You (Linda McIntyre)

Celebrating 100 Years
This year 2024 three of our most famous icons celebrate their 100th birthdays. The War Memorial, the County Offices and the Ingewood Library. These three icons are a part of our history and cultural significance to our community. The story of the War Memorial is particularly touching. It's a testament to the community's dedication to honouring those who served in World War I. In 1920 the Ingewood Council first talked about building a memorial for the soldiers who died during the 1st World War (1914-1918). In 1923 it was decided to erect the Memorial across the road from the Post Office. Our second icon celebrating a 100 birthday is the building which once housed the Ingewood County Offices. The Ingewood County was originally known as the Moa Roads Board. Their building was built by F C Cooper and the Architects were Messinger, Griffiths and Taylor. The building was opened on 19 December 1924. In 1982 the building became inadequate and new premises were built on Collard Street. In 1984 it was sold and in 1985 Deem and Shauer, Solicitors, moved from Kelly Street took over the premises. In 2017 it was taken over by Goulet Quinlan, law firm from New Plymouth. Our last but definitely not least, would be the Ingewood Municipal Library and on Saturday 7 September 8 days and 100 years after the building was first officially opened the Ingewood Community along with invited guests celebrated its 100th birthday.

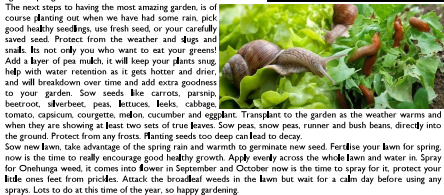
Ingewood's 150th Jubilee Celebrations

Gardening Clues with Sue (Sue Hinds)
Did you think about which crops you want to plant, and even got together some materials to make you own plant protection since the last edition of Garden Clues! Early spring weather is like a bag of almonds, one day sunny and warm, the next we are stoking up the fire, with chilly mornings and evenings. Do not be lulled into mass plantings at this time of the year, steady but surely will win the race against spring conditions. The next steps to having the most amazing garden, is of course planting out when you have had some rain, pick good healthy seedlings, use fresh seed, or your carefully saved seed. Protect from the weather and slugs and snails. Its not only you who want to eat your greens! Add a layer of peat mulch, it will keep your plants snug, help with water retention as it gets hotter and drier, and will breakdown over time and add extra goodness to your garden. Sow seeds like carrots, parsnip, beetroot, silverbeet, peas, butternuts, leeks, cabbage, tomato, capsicum, courgettes, melon, cucumber and eggplant. Transplant to the garden as the weather warms and when they are showing at least two sets of true leaves. Sow peas, snow peas, runner and bean beans directly into the ground. Protect from any frosts. Planting seeds too deep can lead to decay. Sow new lawns, take advantage of the spring rain and warmth to germinate new seed. Fertilise your lawn for spring. For Onions week, it comes into flower in September and October now is the time to spray for it, protect your lawn one feet from prods. Attack the broad leaf weeds in the lawn but wait for a calm day before using any sprays. Lots to do at this time of the year, so happy gardening.

One aspect of the regional Food Security Project is to look collaboratively at food supply and distribution, funding and resources, and to build cohesion across all of the social services who are engaged in wider holistic care for whanau affected by food insecurity. This is a big project and although we are closely working how this is developing in other parts of our region, we here in Ingewood, with the support from the Community Development Adviser from NPDC, are being asked to honorate about what this will look like for us. 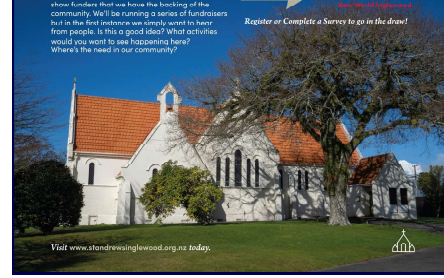


Taranaki Floral Art Designer Of The Year (Judy Williams)
